DOCUMENT 1



French worldwide

Our planet has nearly 6 billion inhabitants, who live in approximately 200 countries or states. The people living in these countries speak in different tongues. There exists several hundred languages. A number of them are spoken only by a few thousand inhabitants. English is the most utilised in international trade, but Chinese is spoken by the greatest number of people. Throughout the world, over 200 million persons use French daily, 60 million in France and the rest in such countries as Belgium, Switzerland, Canada and certain African countries

French School

In France school is mandatory until the age of 16. Children first go to grade (Elementary) school, then to High school then to college. The very young go to kindergarten, which welcomes children of less than six years of age and is not obligatory, but it does prepare them for grade school and it is suggested to parents to enroll their children. In grade school, basic knowledge is acquired which prepares children for the adult world: reading, writing and arithmetic, as well as a learning a foreign language, becoming familiar with computers and many other things. That is why it is required to be assiduous and punctual. When a pupil misses school, he must bring a letter of excuse, signed by his parents.

Each school has five classes, which follow each other in turn, and which correspond to five levels of learning. As an example, here is a schedule of courses for eight-year olds :
